OPFCC Targeted Youth Service

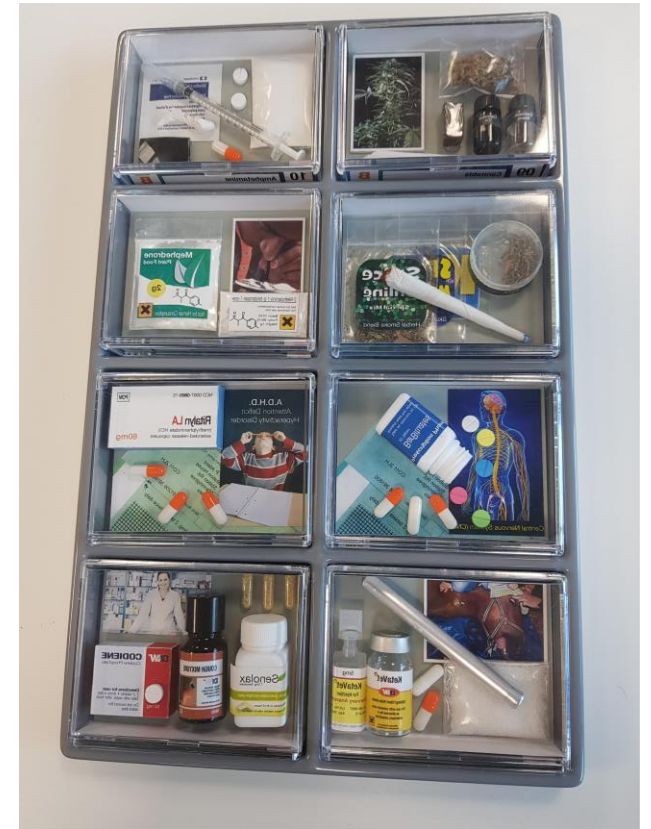
- Part of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioners Team established in December 2019.
- Established to divert young people divert from criminal activity specifically focusing on; Anti-Social Behaviour, Child Sexual Exploitation, Child Criminal Exploitation, Urban Street Gangs and Social Exclusion.
- Tier Two service which works in partnership with young people through voluntary engagement
- Supporting young people who are aged 10 – 18years old
- Support provided to local agencies and employers – to make contextual safe guarding everybody's business

OPFCC Targeted Youth Service



One to One Work

- Supporting young people who have experienced Adverse Childhood Experiences, trauma and those who are vulnerable
- Weekly visits – this could be at school, home or in the community and bespoke to individuals needs
- Impact of support measured through learning outcome star – completed at start, middle and end of intervention
- Intervention consist of approximately 12 sessions, however this is flexible (shorter/longer) depending on needs
- Partnership working and onward referrals to agencies



Group Work

- Tailor made packages to suit the needs of the young people
- Purpose of group projects are to reduce anti-social behaviour, child sexual exploitation and child criminal exploitation
- Length of a group project is between 6 – 12 weeks
- We do also provide one off group sessions focusing on a specific topic such as drop down days



Detached Youth Work



- Weekly detached sessions across multiple locations around the county – currently working in Wellingborough, Corby, Rushden, Kettering, Sixfields, Racecourse, Daventry
- Working in close partnership with neighbourhood policing teams to identify needs of young people
- Engage with vulnerable young people within their community while exploring youth related issues
- Working in partnership with both communities and agencies to support young people needs holistically
- Work with local organisations to identify sustainable support for young people

YOUTH COMMISSION

- 22 young people were offered a place on the 2020/21 Youth Commission, in addition to 7 young people from the original Youth Commission – total of 29 young people
- 31% of the 2021 OPFCC Youth Commission are from BAME Communities
- Representatives from Corby, Kettering, Wellingborough, East Northants, South Northants and Northampton
- 14 young people took up the offer of being an OPFCC Schools Champion

Our Impact

In 2021 our service:

- Had contact with 2244 young people on detached across the whole of the county
- 172 young people referred for group work
- 156 young people referred for one to one support

Measuring impact is completed in group work and 1-2-1 using an outcome star. This allows young people to identify on a scale of 1 to 5 across 8 topics how they would score. In 2021 all young people who scored a 2 or below during their first outcome star scored higher during the final outcome star
