Message From the Principal



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Team Rushden - United we stand, divided we fall

Dear Parent / Carer

This week's assembly covered settling back into the rhythm of school life and appreciating the challenges that we and others may face. We discussed the importance of learning and knowing more so that we can make educated decisions. Team Rushden's values are always at the heart of our work, celebrating diversity and appreciating that everyone brings something unique to the team is highly important.

The government has now confirmed that all young people aged 12 to 15 are being offered a first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. The government commented that vaccinating young people should help to reduce the need for young people to have time off school and should reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19 within schools. The main purpose of the COVID-19 childhood vaccination programme is therefore to provide protection to the young people who receive the vaccine and to reduce the disruption to face-to-face education this winter.

In preparation the NHS is planning to deliver a schools-based vaccination programme, which is like the successful model used for vaccinations including for HPV and Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio (DTP), supported by GPs and community pharmacies. Parental, guardian or carer consent will be sought by vaccination healthcare staff prior to vaccination in line with existing school vaccination programmes. Like all school-based vaccination programmes, the vaccine will be administered by healthcare staff with appropriate qualifications who are trained in the vaccination of children and young people.

It is fantastic and a relief that the attendance figures are high, the school is feeling 'normal' once more and I am sure we can all agree that it feels good to be back. Pupils have been reminded to follow good hygiene rules and look after themselves and others. Let's keep heading in the right direction!

European Day of Languages



This year will be the 20th anniversary of the European Day of Languages: a celebration of linguistic and cultural diversity. To recognise the day, faculties have been asked to bring a European twist to their normal lessons and have come up with some great ideas for our students to enjoy next Friday:

English:

Literature from other cultures from the Grimm Brothers and Hans Christian Anderson.

Maths:

Learning numbers in another language and completing their calculations in these languages.

Science:

Year 11 will revise history of the periodic table focussing on the culture and background of Mendeleev and Dobereiner (Russian and German). Year 7-10 will do a treasure hunt trail looking at significant discoveries or inventions by European scientists. Students will mark on map the discovery/ invention in both English and the language of the scientist before writing a conclusion back in the lab about collaboration with scientists in Europe.

Creative Arts:

European cities, their famous buildings and landmarks.

PE:

Try out some European sports including Gaelic football!

The day before we have a very exciting talk lined up for our students. Ms Wiles and Miss Jepson have arranged for Corporal Moore, an RAF intelligence analyst, to talk to us about his job and how he uses his language skills.

Depth: 450mm



Check if You or Your Child has Coronavirus Symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- ◆ a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- ◆ a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- ◆ a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.

Use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service if:

- ◆ you're worried about your symptoms
- ◆ you're not sure what to do

Are You Eligible for Free School Meals?

If you are in receipt of any of the following, your child may be eligible for free school meals.

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, with no element of Working Tax Credit, and a household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit - income dependant
