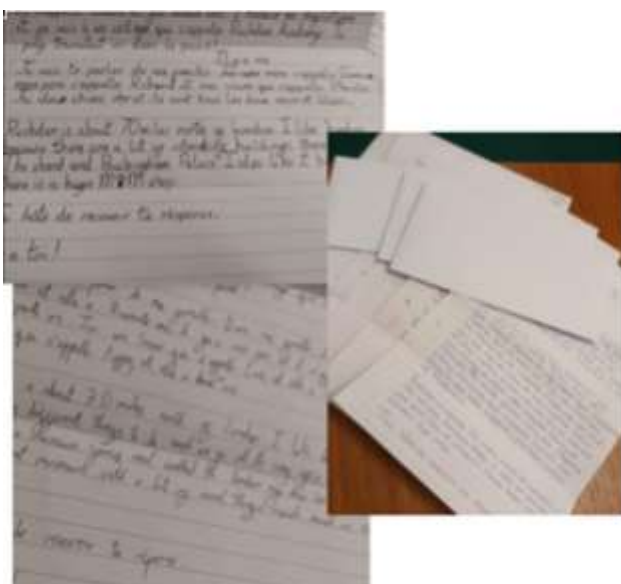
Our year 7s were really interested to learn about some of the ways that **la vie scolaire** differs in France and are looking forward to learning even more from their pen pals.

Dance

It's the last week of dance, assessments have been completed and Miss Pilgrim has designed lessons which are filled with fun topical games for all year groups. Well done to Year 11 Dance students for completing part of their BTEC exam on Wednesday!

Music

Year 9 finished their Music for Media coursework by completing the addition of sound effects to their silent film clip. They also made use of Bandlab software to create tension by adding music by way of pre-recorded musical loops and adding these as an mp3 file to the clip in Windows Media Editor. In total there were 15 separate mp3 files needing to be added to the silent clip and the class found the addition of the musical loops created a significantly enhanced viewing experience. All in all students found the project interesting as to the different components that make up the film experience.

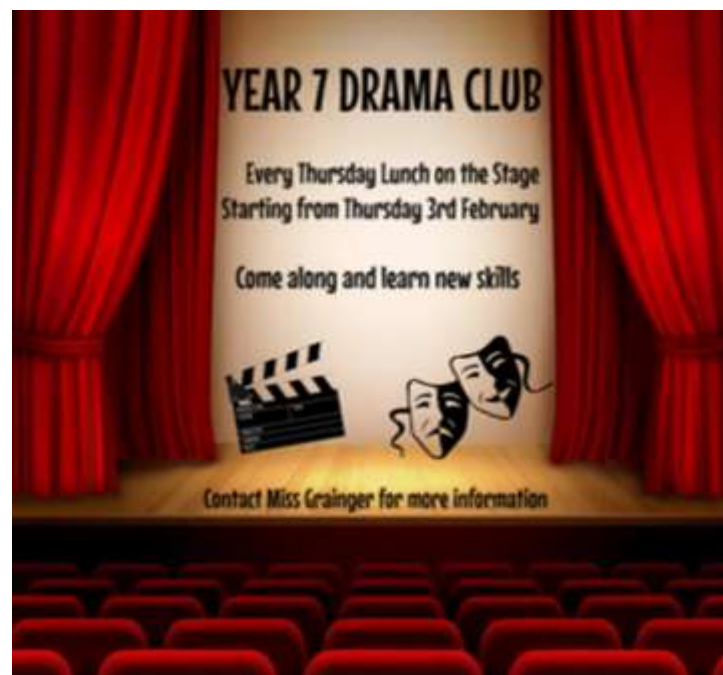
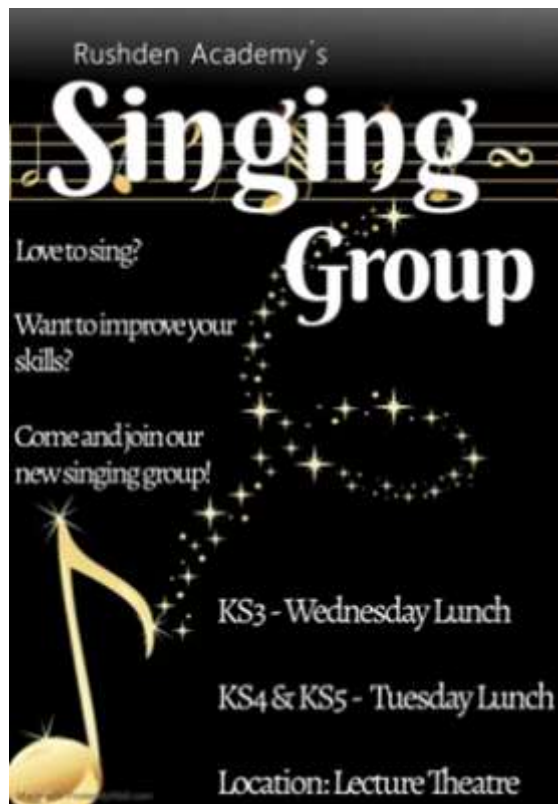

The event is delivered by the award-winning human anatomist Samuel Piri who has been featured on the BBC, The Discovery Channel & Medicplayer.

At the event, Sam and his team will provide the opportunity for students to participate in the dissection of real organ specimens including a head & brain, lungs & heart as well as a digestive tract showcasing the stomach, liver, gall bladder, pancreas and intestines. The day is rigorously academic with students receiving award-winning insight into how the body works and the challenges faced by the next generation of medical professionals.

All of the content is carefully matched to the main GCSE, A-Level & BTEC specifications and is relevant to the study students are undertaking in the classroom. The event operates in such a way that it appeals to the students considering both medicine, dentistry & veterinary science as well as those considering; nursing, midwifery, paramedic science, occupational therapy, pharmacology, biomedical science and sports sciences.

How to Access Go4Schools

Go4Schools is the online system that Rushden Academy uses to track student attendance, student progress and assign homework tasks.

Students and parents can access this at home to keep up to date, by checking timetables and homework deadlines. Student progress reports will be published through Go4Schools 3 times a year.

Check if You or Your Child has Coronavirus Symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- ◆ **a high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- ◆ **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- ◆ **a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.

Use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service if:

- ◆ you're worried about your symptoms
- ◆ you're not sure what to do
