

## Ethos Identity Workshops



This week all of Years 7, 8 and 9 have been engaging with our Ethos Identity Workshops.

These workshops have involved a powerful 1 hour performance and 1 hour workshop from Rights of Passage Productions, who work all over the country delivering workshops and performances to improve student outcomes and tackle current issues.

The students explored the theme of the mask and how easy it is to hide in school rather than be ourselves.

This is what some of our students said about the days:

### **What is the main thing you learnt from today?**

"That it is okay to speak up about your problems."

"How people act is not actually how they think or feel"

"I learnt that showing people my values is more positive than putting on a mask."

"How bullies wear a mask to hide their true selves."

"It showed me how to forgive."

### **What one thing will you do differently as a result of today?**

"Be more honest with people"

"I'm not going to hide as much anymore"

"Be more patient with people"

"Try to talk about things more"

The workshops have been a real success and the students have really enjoyed learning more about how to be fully themselves at school.

## Year 11 Uniform Donations

### Cost of Living Payment

#### **Guidance on getting an extra payment to help with the cost of living if you're entitled to certain benefits or tax credits.**

You may be able to get a payment to help with the cost of living if you're getting certain benefits or tax credits.

You do not need to apply. If you're eligible, you'll be paid automatically in the same way you usually get your benefit or tax credits. The payments will be made separately from your benefit or tax credits.

These payments are not taxable and will not affect the benefits or tax credits you get.

You may be eligible if you are:

- on Low income benefits
- on Tax Credits
- on Disability Benefits
- entitled to Winter Fuel Benefits




## Library Update



## Creative Arts Update

This term in the Creative arts students across the Academy have been very busy.

**In year 7** we have been learning about Line, Pattern, Colour and Abstraction. We have learnt about Organic and Geometric patterns and have explored using them in our own designs, either in the 'Crazy Hair' or 'Initial Letter' design work. We have also been learning about Colour theory, and should be able to tell you examples of warm and cool colours, complementary pairs, primary, secondary and tertiary colours. We know how to mix these using watercolours and have practised applying watercolours to our own designs and copies of artists' work, including Henri Matisse and Hunderwasser. We have begun learning about Abstraction, creating compositions using line, colour and shapes.



**In year 8** we have been practising and developing our observational drawing skills using man-made objects such as bottles and containers. We have put this practice to good use in our artist studies related to Pop Art, and have created our own compositions inspired by the work of Roy Lichtenstein. We have been introduced to acrylic paints and have learnt how these are used differently to watercolours, and have secured our skills in painting using both acrylics and watercolour techniques.

## Creative Arts Update

In year 9 we have been securing our observational drawing skills looking at still life, with a project inspired by Paul Cezanne. We have used an array of different techniques and media to create our own work inspired by this artist, and will soon be moving on to create assemblage collages combining all our work from this year. We have learnt to select appropriate media and techniques for different images and have begun to identify our own strengths and preferences with different methods and styles. We understand the importance of observation in creating accurate art work, and are able to make creative choices based on our knowledge and experience.



In year 10 art we have been working towards our GCSE Coursework, which will be complete by Christmas 2022 ready for our Exam Unit. Our project is loosely based on Still Life, but we have each chosen our own artists to study and are creating interesting and individual projects centred around the work of these practitioners. This year has been about identifying and refining our creative strengths, and building the skills we need to be able to work independently on future projects. We started with workshops to build practical skills in all media, before choosing artists to focus on. We have learnt how to conduct artist research and show our understanding visually using our own images and observations, and have refined our presentation skills, using large mounted sheets to showcase our work. In our Mock exam we will finish our responses to artists' work, and from September we will begin developing our projects towards creating a final outcome.

In year 10 photography we have started looking at Double Exposure which is our coursework element worth 60% of our final grade. We have taken our own photographs of nature, architecture and portraiture which we will combine together to create interesting compositions. We have previously learnt how to analyse photographs and create work using Photoshop in a pop art style.



In year 10 graphics we have been looking at typography and the use of colour and line along with looking at various designers and illustrators and creating work in the style of. Currently we are undertaking our coursework element where we are designing and creating an album cover based on our research that we have undertaken and designer influence. We can create our album covers through editing photographs we have taken, our own illustrations or a combination.



In year 12 Photography we have been: This term year 12 students have visited Hunstanton to work on a location shoot. They photographed the coast line and local areas of interest to inform their practical work. They are currently working on the related study which is an essay that demonstrates their understanding of photography in the context that they have chosen to learn about.

This is an independent unit of work and all of them are making excellent progress and producing some brilliant essays.

If you are in receipt of any of the following, your child may be eligible for free school meals.

- Child Tax Credit, with no element of Working Tax Credit, and a household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
