Message From the Principal

Dear Parent / Carer

There is so much that I could have included this week based on all the great things happening around the school which makes it a challenge to decide what to share; a good challenge nonetheless!

Firstly, our Year 11 students have been undertaking their mocks and I have been delighted with their collective attitude towards these important trial examinations. It is a really important opportunity to identify their individual strengths and areas for development with teachers also being able to prioritise common areas of weakness to re-teach. The mock examinations continue next week.

With the cost of living soaring, Mr Smith and our student leadership team led a monumental drive to secure contributions for the local food bank. In total, 386kg of food was collected which is a staggering amount and I would like to thank everyone for their contributions. In addition, the sixth form charity team also led a Christmas shoe box appeal and secured contributions for an amazing 24 boxes in total - I am extremely proud of Team Rushden's efforts on both of these!

Mr Firth led an assembly to all year groups on two of our core values, hard work and resilience, which used the on-going battle between the Mercedes and Red Bull formula 1 teams to illustrate many important lessons. In particular, students were encouraged to reflect on the importance of responding positively to both criticism and setbacks in order to ultimately come back stronger.

As part of our extensive personal development programme, Mr Noblett - our Ethos leader - organised for a company called Loud Mouth to come in and deliver a piece of drama constructed around the important topic of harmful sexualised behaviours. Students observed the piece and were then afforded the opportunity to ask the characters questions about their behaviours as part of breakout sessions. The response from students was very mature given the sensitive nature of the content and they all got a lot out of the workshop.

In terms of celebrating student success, our Year 9 boys football team were victorious in the 7 a-side district football tournament winning an impressive 6 out of their 7 games - a big well done to them!

Drama

Sleeping Beauty has fabulous songs and dancing that audience members of all ages will love.

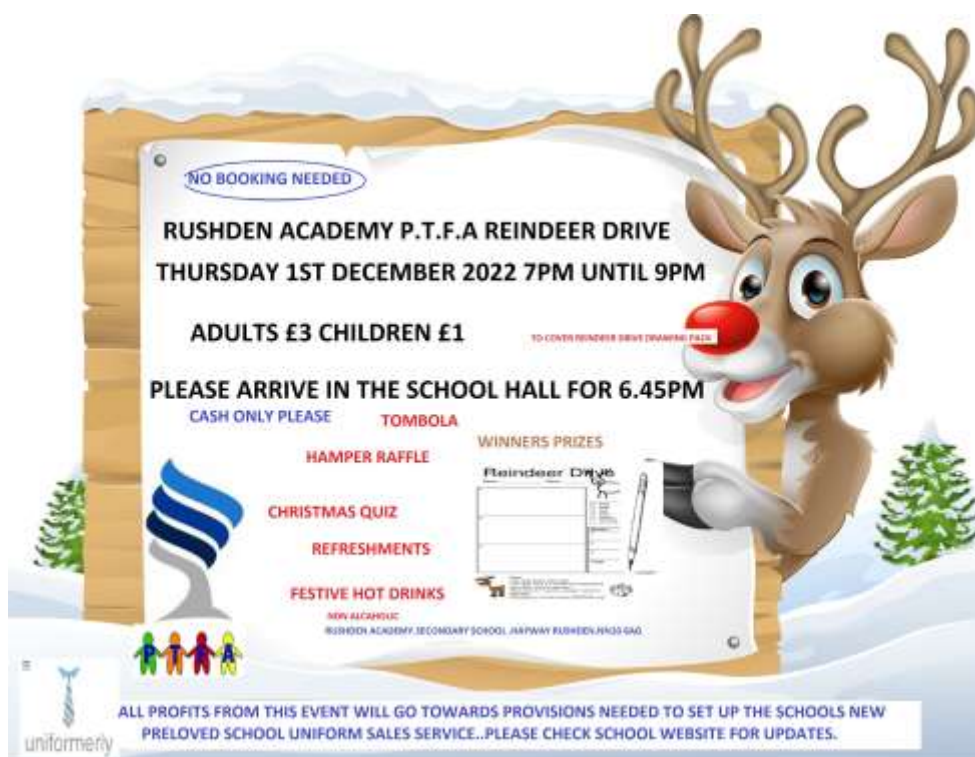


The pantomime tickets will go on sale from reception from 1st December. We hope to see as many of you there as possible.

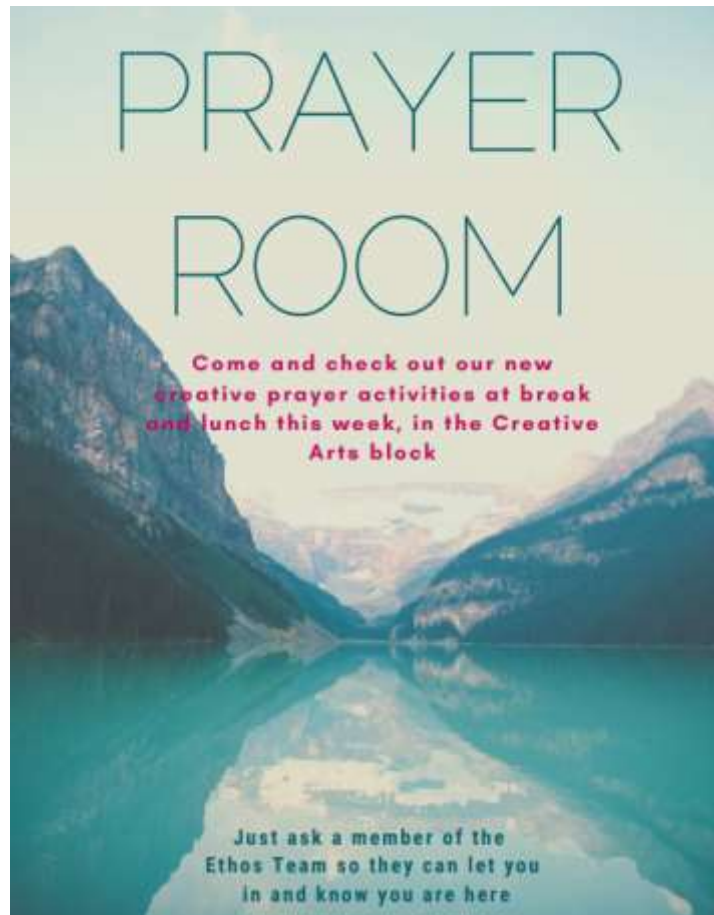

Week 5 – 9

It's been a busy month!!

The rain stopped and the weather has been really nice ever since. Schools opened back up 2 weeks ago after all the festivals ended! It has been great to get back into all the schools and begin teaching again. This past month has been amazing from trips to Chitwan National safari park to watching sunrise and even doing a 3-day trek!!

As the festivals ended some more people left and more people arrived. For some of the volunteers leaving dinner we all dressed Nepali! And wore Sari and traditional clothing. Over the festival season we began going to one school and running some fun workshops and mini lessons! Going to that school every day for the past month has led me to build really good relationships with the students there that I'm going to miss very much when I have to leave!!



Also, when the main festival days were taking place and no kids showed up to the schools I was working on a presentation for Women empowerment about family health. Ranging from topics such as transferable diseases to menstruation and menopause. I then presented it to 6 different groups of women all ranging in age and language abilities! It was so rewarding after I had finished as the program coordinator had told me all the women had loved

learning about the topics in my presentation!

Time after projects in the week were normal spent lesson planning for the next day. But one day we all decided to give paddle boarding a go! I wasn't the best but didn't fall in the water so that's good! The last 2 weeks going back into the schools, I have been teaching about parts of plants and photosynthesis, different textures of objects in nature, basic hygiene like washing our hands and brushing our teeth, and a lot more!

It has been a great experience this last 2 months and a bit! Now with only 2 weeks left till I come home! I'm really going to cherish these last weeks as although I think my time is definitely coming to its natural end, I am very sad to be leaving. And think that I will definitely come back to Pokhara, Nepal in the future!

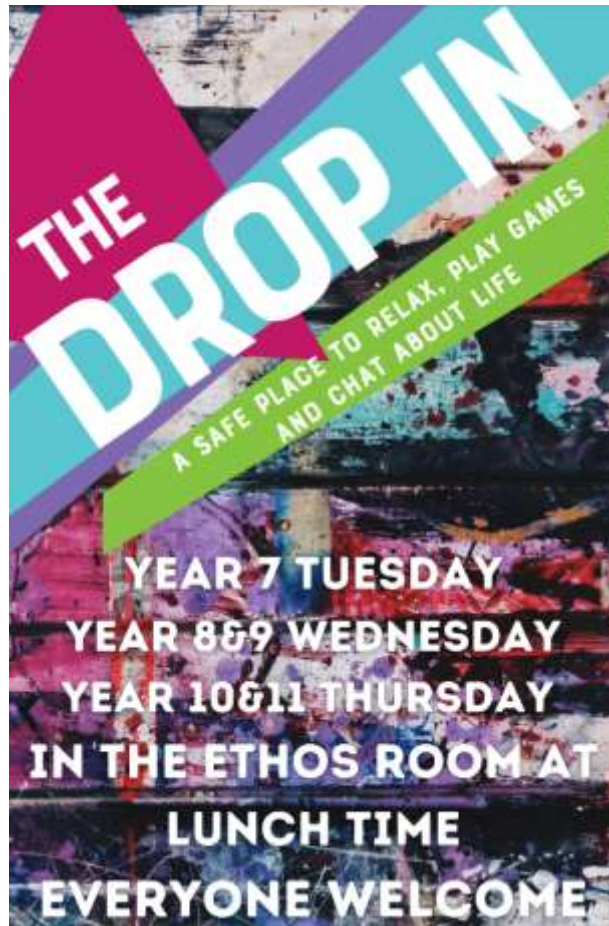

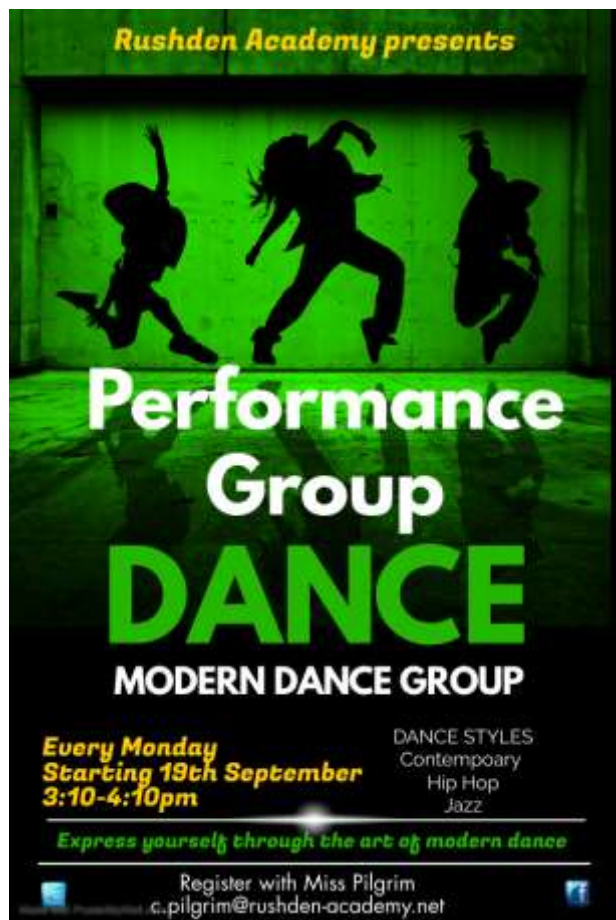
