




Ketchup Clouds by Annabel Pitcher


Silence is Goldfish by Annabel Pitcher


Holes by Louis Sachar






The Seeing Stone by Kevin Crossley Holland.


Meet Skulduggery Pleasant: detective, sorcerer, warrior.
