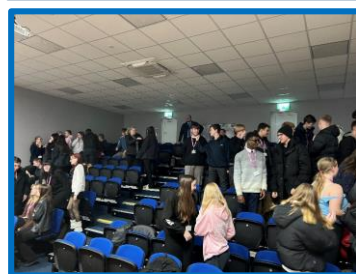

YEAR 12 AUSCHWITZ VISIT

Since 1999, over 41,000 students and teachers have taken part in the Holocaust Educational Trust's groundbreaking Lessons from Auschwitz Project.

Based on the premise that 'hearing is not like seeing', this four-part course explores the universal lessons of the Holocaust and its relevance for today. The LFA Project aims to increase knowledge and understanding of the Holocaust for young people and to clearly highlight what can happen if prejudice and racism become acceptable.

The visits to the former Nazi concentration and death camp of Auschwitz-Birkenau are preceded and followed by half-day seminars in order to ensure an exceptional educational experience.

This is a **free trip**, only open to **2 students** and will happen on **13th March 2024**.

It doesn't matter what subjects you study, history is not a requirement but an interest in it is beneficial.

At this stage, you are expressing your interest in going on the visit. All letters and further information will be released when I know who will be going.

To take part you must have **parental permission** so please make sure you ask them before writing your letter. You also need to hold a valid passport with 6th month left on after the 13th March 2024.
